He and Thais will be deeply missed; his humble servant leadership has produced ten quality years of service to our district. We salute them and thank them both of the years of commitment to the NCO district.

Please find attached two documents:

- 1. The **profile of our district** that was developed through a variety of means. We held three area focus group meetings composed of 89 people representing 31 churches, an online survey of our district pastors both active and retired with 55 responses, and a survey sent to all church board secretaries for discussion during their January board meetings which produced 104 responses from 26 churches.
- 2. Additionally, the DAC utilized the responses to build a **position profile** to be used as nominations are reviewed.

All nominations will be screened and vetted for adherence to both the position profile and the Board of General Superintendents' directive that we search for one 'whose ministerial record demonstrates an emphasis on growth, missional effectiveness, evidence of denominational loyalty and fiscal responsibility.'

Logic tells us the wider we cast our net, the stronger the possibility exists we will gather more candidates. We believe the Lord is already preparing our next district leader for us. It is our prayer, and one we certainly hope you'll join us in praying, that this process will bring us together in His divine will, providence, and timing.

District Profile

The North Central Ohio District serves to advance God's kingdom by encouraging and resourcing the local church to accomplish the mission of the Church of the Nazarene within each church's unique context. We are fortunate to have a compact geographical area with 63 organized churches, 2 compassionate ministries in 22 counties in the central and northeastern part of Ohio. Our district stretches from the outskirts of Columbus north to Lake Erie, encompassing the cities of Delaware, Marion, Wooster, Mansfield, Sandusky, and the metropolitan Cleveland area, then east along the lake to Ashtabula and the PA border.

Our congregations range in size from 12-1053 (as reported in 2016), most in rural communities. We have 12 churches averaging over 200 in their worship services; 13 churches averaging fewer than 30 in attendance. Along with our Arabic and Hispanic congregations in Cleveland, we continue to experience great outreach and blessings through the ministry of Lighthouse, Inc., and their subsidiary ministry of Heaventrain (a big blue bus that takes Jesus into the toughest neighborhoods of Cleveland each weekend). Our largest churches are in smaller cities; ones with heavy Caucasian populations.

An example of this wide range of socio-economic characteristics is the district's connection to and responsibility in the progressive and prosperous northern suburbs of Columbus in Delaware County contrasted with the extreme poverty and dysfunction of the inner city of Cleveland in Cuyahoga County, our most heavily populated area. Throughout the 42 years of the district's existence, we have been blessed by great success stories but also some strong disappointments.

NCO is very fortunate to have Mount Vernon Nazarene University as part of our district. Throughout the year, MVNU serves as a resource to our ministers and lay leaders through seminars and training events. The University also graciously hosts our assembly and family camp each July.

Our district and the pastors who serve with us are very much a family. There is a strong sense of community, love and support for each other. We have a strong foundation in all auxiliary ministries and our annual camp meeting. We believe that pastoring (serving as a God-called shepherd) is an awesome privilege and responsibility.
